## **Plants Tolerant of Black Walnut Trees**

The Black Walnut tree contains a substance that is toxic to many plants. The chemical juglone is present in all parts of the tree and affects plants growing beneath and around the tree. Juglone damage appears as yellowing or browning of leaves, stunted growth or failure to grow. Damage caused by juglone cannot be reversed. The tolerance is not known of all plants. For those plants not listed, try planting a small number of plants and look for signs of damage for at least a full growing season before planting additional plants.
